

## **The British Society of Dowsers Training Programme**

### **Dowsing for Water – Completion of Professional Training**

**Tutored by an experienced professional water dowser. Timing and duration determined by tutor and student**

#### **Aim**

- To train an individual student to the standard required to become a professional water dowser

#### **Objective: At the end of this course, the students will :**

- Be able to demonstrate knowledge and practical skills in water dowsing to a standard required for the BSD's Register of Professional Dowsers
- Have completed at least one successful supervised borehole case

**The Trainee:** Is normally expected to have completed the two previous Dowsing for Water Courses (Introduction to Dowsing for Water and Dowsing for Water – Professional Preparation)

It is anticipated that, if good progress has been made to date, this part of the training should not exceed 15 hours

#### **Course Content:**

- The Professional Water Dowser will accompany the student on a dowsing task for a client and the follow-up drilling process
- The Professional Water Dowser will relate case studies from his/her own experience, passing on advice, discussing pitfalls and how problems have been resolved
- The Professional Water Dowser will assess whether the student is conversant with UK regulations, has developed a good, professional relationship with the client and driller and generally upholds the Professional ethical standards of the BSD
- The Professional Water Diviner will, providing the Student has achieved the required standard, provide BSD with a reference in a form acceptable to the BSD to enable the Student to apply to join the members' Register of Professional Dowsers as a Water Dowser
- The Student and Mentor will be expected to agree fees for this training
