Earth Energies & Environmental Healing - Understanding Geopsychic Stress (EE3)

Tutored by BSD Registered Tutor, experienced in dowsing and treating Geopathic and Geopsychic Stress. In weekend format or minimum 12 hours tuition

Aim

- To give instruction and guidance in working with energetic trauma and displacement in landscape and place

Objectives: At the end of the course students will be able to:

- Creatively work with and treat geopsychic stress
- Show that they understand cases of spirit trauma, both human and non-human
- Explain the issues of place memory and curses
- Demonstrate that they understand and can work with psychic boundaries and portals
- Demonstrate an understanding and appreciation of issues in a wider landscape and regional context

Dowsing for Geopsychic stress

- Coach students in the personal processes of spiritual connection leading to establishing contact with spirit guides and other sources of psychic guidance and support.
- Introduction to practices and techniques applying to possible sources of psychic concern, trauma or displacement including :
 - Earth energies and Geopathic stress
 - Place memory
 - Fragmented energy patterns
 - Psychic boundaries
 - Pathways of intention, lines of connection and portals
 - Intentional patterns and curses
 - Traumatized or displaced spirits of any kind
 - Guardian spirits
 - Earthbound human spirits,
 - Non-human entities
 - Demons
 - Spirits of familiar realms, including nature and elemental spirits
 - Spirits of non- familiar realms including aliens

Training and coaching students in intention and psychic practice

Ensure students are appropriately aware of and connected to support, guidance and protection from appropriate, healthy, known and trusted spiritual sources.

Support and safety net

Ensure students understand that personal risk is involved in some of these practices and that a good support network of friends and other practitioners is essential for safe practice. The tutor of this course will have a duty of care to support students as necessary and appropriate.

Professionalism and Ethics

Review professional and ethical considerations for working in public and offering services to the public, including the necessity of reviewing/staying in touch with clients until either a satisfactory outcome is achieved or else an appropriate further referral has been made.
